D. Gray building, removing the obsolete tennis courts, and restoring the wetland and buffer area on the property. It is [petitioners'] hope that in addition to the existing athletic fields, this park will eventually include a gazebo, children's playground, recreational courts, farmers' market and community gardens, which may or may not require private or public funds.
